corrective measures. This system helps in maintaining the quality of the teaching learning process. Students also fill student satisfaction forms. There are eight parameters in the form namely Teaching-Learning process, Conduct of Examination, Library facilities, Extra-curricular activities, Sports facilities, Security services, Grievance Redressal and Drinking Water and Washroom facilities. The infrastructural / Co-curricular facilities are improved by the college authorities as a regular practice. The feedback given by the students in the students' satisfaction form is taken into consideration during this process. The departments of Computer Science and Information Technology collect the online feedback through Google forms. Feedback is also obtained from the parents through the scheduled parent teachers meeting. Their suggestions and concerns are noted down and considered critically for the overall improvement of the college function for the benefits of the students. Every department has its own alumni group continuously interacting with their teachers through social media platform and giving positive feedback about the improvement of the department and College as a whole. Once in a year, alumni meeting is called by the college. The Alumni share their valuable inputs with the College authority and willingly help in the quality improvement of the College.

4.4.2 – Procedures and policies for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc. (maximum 500 words) (information to be available in institutional Website)

A decent and well-maintained physical infrastructure with essential amenities is the basis for delivering a better education environment for all the stakeholders. The college authorities have been continuously taking several corrective measures to facilitate a better learning environment. Wellestablished policies and procedures adhering to the required standards are followed to augment its existing infrastructure and develop new ones for facilitating new programmes. Following are the few concrete steps and monitoring mechanisms that the college authorities have adopted for maintaining its various facilities within the college campus: • Campus Security: ? Security personnels outsourced from a dedicated security agency are deployed 24x7 to safeguard the entire campus, ? The entire campus is networked with IP based CCTV setup for vigilance. ? An adequate number of different categories of fire extinguishers are installed at appropriate locations within the campus. Every year, fire fighting training through experts is being organized to train our support staff to handle unforeseen emergencies. ? Security personnel cabins and a Visitors cabin with a visitor management system are established at college entry gates to check visitors. • Basic Amenities: ? Drinking water: A standard UV water filtration plant is implemented for facilitating the supply of safe drinking water at various locations within the college campus. An adequate number of water purifiers and water coolers are also installed. ? Washroom and Toilets: With the increasing students strength, two additional well-furnished fabricated toilet blocks have been installed at two separate locations within the college campus. Sanitary Vending Machines are also placed in ladies washrooms. ? Canteen: A separate canteen block is built within the college premises. This facility is outsourced to a professional caterer through a yearly contract for providing hygienic and delicious food at an economical rate. ? Ladies common room: A separate room for girls is being provided for their privacy and comfort. • Repairs and Maintenance: ? The college authority has appointed an Army Major to administer the day to day issues related to infrastructure repairs and college maintenance ? Any repairs and maintenance tasks related to electrical, plumbing, carpentry, civil and others are addressed through outsourcing the work to professional handymen and contractors. A separate register for registering requisitions and complaints is maintained for appropriate, timely action. ? Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC)

for computers, Fire Extinguishers, Pest Control, Laboratory Apparatus, Printers, Photocopying Machines, Water Coolers, Fans, Air Conditioners and Water Purifiers are outsourced with private agencies. ? An adequate number of outsourced housekeeping staff has been deployed on a full-time basis to take care of the campuss housekeeping jobs, gardening, and campus beautification. • ICT Amenities: ? The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled for providing internet facility to staff and students. ? The functioning and delivery of services are automated with the ICT setup for facilitating speedy services to students and staff. ? RFID and Biometric system is adopted to maintain discipline and keeping track of students and staff attendance. ? A dedicated, dynamic website and mobile app are designed and maintained through a private vendor

5.3.2 – Activity of Student Council & amp; representation of students on academic & amp; administrative bodies/committees of the institution (maximum 500 words)

The Student council is the students leadership of the institution. It is also to inculcate the leadership values in the students and train them to be future leaders in the society. #### 6.1 – Institutional Vision and Leadership

B. K. Birla College (Autonomous), Kalyan a multi-faculty premier institution of higher learning, with an enrolment of 7,000 students (for UG, PG and Research Programmes) is affiliated to the University of Mumbai. The College was established in 1972, by Kalyan Citizens' Education Society with the blessings of Late Shri B. K. Birla ji and Late Smt. Sarala ji Birla. Under Autonomy various bodies has been constituted like Governing Council, Board of Studies, Academic Council, Finance Committee, and Board of Examinations for the smooth functioning of both Academic and Administrative activities as per the University guidelines. The institution has a well-designed organogram with different bodies and committees. It aims to encourage leadership and manage different functions in tune with its vision and mission. 1. Participatory Management: The Institution has developed a system of efficient administration consisting of Director (Education), Principal and Vice Principals (Faculty wise and Unaided Courses). We have our own internal control mechanism where systems and processes are designed to safeguard an organization's assets for accurate financial reporting, effective operations, and compliance with laws and regulations.
