15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The College offers several interdisciplinary programs like B.Sc. (Biotechnology), B. Voc. - Medical Laboratory Technology, Cyber Security and Forensics, Business Management and Entrepreneurial Development, and Financial Market and Trading Operations, M.Com. (E-commerce), B.Com. 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses students' learning levels and organises special programmes for both slow and advanced learners.

The Teaching-Learning process of the college tranistioned from the online to hybrid learning mode in the year 2022-23, while contuining to optimally use Microsoft 365 for teaching, learning, and evaluation.

The College assesses students' learning levels through Orientation program, where students have been made aware of various curricular and co-curricular activities of the college. The Faculty Members in their introductory sessions review the baseline knowledge level of the learners and accordingly plan and modify, their teaching methods and other academic activities as per the learning needs.

At the entry level, the Departments conduct a Bridge Course to familiarize and bridge the gap between the existing and new courses. Regular Tests have been conducted during the semester to gauge the students' progress.

Remedial Sessions have been held to provide additional practice and explanation to slow learners. The students who did not succeed in the semester-end examinations were provided additional tutoring before their backlog examination. These sessions improved their comprehension of the courses.

Advanced learners have been encouraged to participate in competitions and peer-learning activities. This gives the advanced learners an opportunity to read more about their subject, explore recent trends, increases their understanding of the courseand enhances their critical thinking skills and higher-level competence. The students are encouraged to undertake online courses on SWAYAM/ NPTEL/ etc. for additional learning and skill development.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences:

The College has integrated learner-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, problem-solving, etc., to create a learning environment that promotes active learning, creates interest and ensure effective delivery of curricula. Each department has adopted some of these methods in their subject specific contexts.

Literary Fests, Exhibitions, Group discussions, and Presentations are some of the teaching tools used by the Humanities Departments. Likewise, the Departments of Social Sciences include exhibitions, surveys, and field visits as a part of teaching pedagogy.

Commerce and Management related courses engage students through methods such as discussion on budget, use of commerce lab, sessions on financial literacy and consumer awareness, case study analysis and discussion, etc. Field and Industrial visits help to provide wider exposure to the students beyond classroom learning.

Pure and applied sciences have adopted hands-on experiments, science fest, nutri fest, nature walks, rose show, mangrove plantations, etc. to provide practical exposure to the learners. The College also organises various activities to encourage

RESEARCH, INNOVATIONS AND EXTENSION

3.1 - Promotion of Research and Facilities

3.1.1 - The institution's research facilities are frequently updated and there is a well-defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

The College adheres to norms, ordinances and regulations formulated by University of Mumbai for research activities. It inculcates research awareness amongst faculty members/students through interaction with eminent scientists from various fields, floating updates of research projects to apply, etc. Newly appointed faculties have been motivated to pursue doctoral/post-doctoral research and undertake Major/ Minor Research Projects. Thefaculty members undertake Minor/Major Research Projects, consultancy from funding agencies and contribute interdisciplinary research.

National/International conferences/seminars/webinars/workshops on topics related to current developments in the field of research have been regularly organized. Students are encouraged to participate in Research Convention viz. Aavishkar, International Economics Research Convention, and various Inter-Collegiate / Institute / Department Research Competitions/Convention to enhance their research temperament. Financial assistance/special leave is granted to faculty members to attend seminars/conferences. Research centers have been upgraded by improving infrastructure, developing sophisticated instrumentation rooms, computational facilities. College provides sophisticated instruments like XRD, FTIR, RT-PCR, AFM, etc. The Department of Environmental Sciences' has established NABL Accredited laboratory for analysis of certain wastewater parameters. The Laboratory provides consultancy services to industries/researchers. The College has well equipped central library facilitating primary/secondary data availability, along with e-resources, in all the fields. The College has 23 research guides and 9 Ph.D. Centres recognized by the University of Mumbai. Workshops pertaining to research methodology and IPR have been organized to promote research outcomes.

3.3 - Innovation Ecosystem

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning, viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipments, etc.

The College is spread over 20 acres of land (including B. K. Birla Public School and B. K. Birla Night College) in the prime location of Kalyan city. The College has an ecofriendly and lush green campus. The college has 7 adequate buildings to cater to the learning needs of the students. One newly constructed building (55,000 sq. ft) accommodates the Science laboratories and classrooms.

There are 72 classrooms of which 34 are smart classrooms and 53 well equipped laboratories with sophisticated instruments. The College has subscribed to Microsoft Office 365, Qurio App, and other educational softwareto support teaching-learning and evaluation. The college has a 3D Lab and a Media Lab.

Central Library, including departmental libraries has over 1,17,465 accessioned books (81,893 physically available after weeding), 1,130 audio-visual materials, 114+ periodicals, 30 eBook readers, and subscriptions to e-databases, allowing access to an enormous collection of e-books and e-journals. During the year an amount of Rs. 204.59 Lakh has been sanctioned and spent by Grasim Industries Ltd. (Unit Century Rayon under CSR activity) for purchasing Furniture of New Building (including Laboratory) and for Electrical Installations work.

The Finance committee of the college meets twice a year and deliberates about financial planning and the soundness of the financial systems and policies. The College management sanctions Rs. 25,000/- for every UG department and Rs.35,000/- for PG departments for organizing the departments curricular and co-curricular activities. The Principal presents a consolidated budget prepared by the departments. It is first presented to the Finance Committee and then approved by the Governing Body. The College Management also grants scholarshipsto the deserving students. Provident Fund and ESI benefits are also made available for Faculty appointed by the Management.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses students' learning levels and organises special programmes for both slow and advanced learners.

The Teaching-Learning process of the college tranistioned from the online to hybrid learning mode in the year 2022-23, while contuining to optimally use Microsoft 365 for teaching, learning, and evaluation.

The College assesses students' learning levels through Orientation program, where students have been made aware of various curricular and co-curricular activities of the college. The Faculty Members in their introductory sessions review the baseline knowledge level of the learners and accordingly plan and modify, their teaching methods and other academic activities per the learning needs.

At the entry level, the Departments conduct a Bridge Course to familiarize and bridge the gap between the existing and new courses. Regular Tests have been conducted during the semester to gauge the students' progress.

Remedial Sessions have been held to provide additional practice and explanation to slow learners. The students who did not succeed in the semester-end examinations were provided additional tutoring before their backlog examination. These sessions improved their comprehension of the courses.

Advanced learners have been encouraged to participate in competitions and peer-learning activities. This gives the advanced learners an opportunity to read more about their subject, explore recent trends, increases their understanding of the courseand enhances their critical thinking skills and higher-level competence. The students are encouraged to undertake online courses on SWAYAM/ NPTEL/ etc. for additional

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning, viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipments, etc.

The College is spread over 20 acres of land (including B. K. Birla Public School and B. K. Birla Night College) in the prime location of Kalyan city. The College has an ecofriendly and lush green campus. The college has 7 adequate buildings to cater to the learning needs of the students. One newly constructed building (55,000 sq. ft) accommodates the Science laboratories and classrooms.

There are 72 classrooms of which 34 are smart classrooms and 53 well equipped laboratories with sophisticated instruments. The College has subscribed to Microsoft Office 365, Qurio App, and

The college has its own internal audit system, where internal checks are continual in addition to the external audit to verify and validate Income and Expenditure and the Institute's capital expenditure. All the accounting processes are checked regularly as per the internal audit system.

All the budgeted expenses are approved by the Head of Departments / In-charges / Principal for smooth functioning of the audit system, and a provision or payment is made in the books of accounts accordingly. The accounts department is entrusted with the maintenance and examination of all the transactions made during a year to conduct methodical verification on a periodic basis. The college has an efficient team of accounts officials, who work in tune with the requirements stated by the auditors. Governing Council ensure proper accounting standards to be followed by the internal control mechanism for payments and receipts.

The stautory auditor is appointed to perform audits of the financial statements of the institution. It is carried out by M.L. Sharma & Co. in two stages viz., Interim Audit and Final Audit. With a view to efficient conduct of activities by the institution, the income and expenditure account, balance sheet and notes to accounts are audited.

The Finance committee of the college meets twice a year and deliberates about financial planning and the soundness of the financial systems and policies. The College management sanctions Rs. 25,000/- for every UG department and Rs.35,000/- for PG departments for organizing the departments curricular and co-curricular activities. The Principal presents a consolidated budget prepared by the departments. It is first presented to the Finance Committee and then approved by the Governing Body. The College Management also grants scholarshipsto the deserving students. Provident Fund and ESI benefits are also made available for Faculty appointed by the Management.

IQAC reviews and strengthens the teaching-learning and evaluation process. Feedback is taken to improve teaching learning process. IQAC has been monitoring and reviewing all the processes of the College regularly to improve its quality quotient.

Several need-based programs at UG and PG Level have been introduced like B. M. S. (Retail Management), B.Voc. (Business Management and Entrepreneurial Development, Financial Market and Trading Operations, Cyber Security and Forensic and Medical Laboratory Technology), M.Com. (Business Management), M.Sc. Mathematics (Applied Mathematics), M.Sc. I.T. (Cloud Computing), etc.

Post-pandemic, the teaching-learning process has become extensively ICT-driven. Various Pedagogical advances have been internalized in the teaching-learning process by faculty training, development programmes, and provision of online pedagogical tools viz. MS Teams Platform, Google Classrooms, Hybrid Classrooms, etc.

Infrastructure Development: A Separate Building for All Science Programs was provided to segregate Junior College from degree College as per the NAAC Peer Team recommendation. An additional space of 55,000 sq. ft was constructed with adequate infrastructure and well-designed and curated Science Laboratories.

IQAC organised various sessions and workshops for students and staff to familiarize them about the changes in the educational framework brought about by NEP 2020. IQAC in consultation with the Departments, deliberated on various aspects like six verticals in each semester of the First Year classes, credit point distribution, mode of delivery of lectures, assessment methods, etc. for effective implementation of NEP 2020.

- 3. Common Rooms: Common rooms facility is available at four locations for girls and two locations for boys separately.
- 4. Ladies' washrooms are equipped with PadCare sanitary napkin disposal bins, and sanitary napkin vending machines in addition to the basic amenities.
- 5. The Students' Council provides help, support and guidance in a holistic way and addresses issues of students. Two Lady Representative arenominated as per the norms of UoM.

Solid Waste Management - Waste bins are provided all over the campus. Segregations of wet and dry waste is practised.

Biocomposting and Vermicomposting is carried out to convert organic waste from college campus to compost.

Organic waste from canteen is converted to fuel by Biogas plant.

Liquid Waste Management - The College has 20 KLD capacity Effluent Treatment Plant (for treating laboratory effluents) and 300 KLD capacity Sewage Treatment Plant (for treating waste water from washrooms). Biomedical Waste Management - The microbial laboratory waste is autoclaved before disposal. The College has a tie-up with 'Padcare' for disposal of sanitary napkins, and installed sanitary napkin collection bins (all ladies washrooms) for recycling.

E-Waste Management- E- waste is collected, segregated and sent to recycling agencies(MPCB/CPCB Authorized E-Waste Disposal Facility) for disposal.

Plastic Waste Management: The College discourages the use of single use plastic on the campus. The students, faculty and staff organise 'Plastic waste collection drive'. Two benches made out of plastic waste collected in the college has been donated to the college by 'Project Mumbai', in lieu of the plastic waste contribution made by the college.
